

College 101 Program Requirements

This program is not meant to be punitive, but rather to assist you in your pursuit of academic success. Please remember that **participation in the College 101 program is mandatory**. The College 101 program consists of the following **required activities**:

- 1. Opening Meeting:** You **must attend** the College 101 Opening Meeting, which will be held in Smith Entrepreneurial Hall beginning at **12:30 p.m. – 4:00 pm on Sunday, January 22, 2017**. The purpose of the meeting is to explain the program and help you explore ways in which you can improve your academic standing. Lunch will NOT be provided.
- 2. Academic Warning/Probation Agreement:** While you are at the College 101 Opening Meeting, you will sign an agreement that outlines the academic expectations that TCU has for you including earning a cumulative GPA at or above a 2.00.
- 3. Advising:** To ensure that you are enrolled in appropriate courses for the spring 2017 semester, you must **meet with your academic advisor during the first week of school**. You and your advisor will discuss your spring 2017 class schedule and make any appropriate changes. To find your academic advisor, log on to my.tcu.edu. You must meet with your advisor **on or before January 20, 2017**.
- 4. Mentoring:** You will be assigned a mentor for the spring 2017 semester. You are expected to **meet with your mentor at least 6 times during the spring before Friday, April 28, 2017**. Your mentor will provide support, encouragement, and guidance to you as you work toward achieving academic good standing. You will receive an e-mail at the beginning of the spring 2017 semester with your mentor's name and email address. You should contact them immediately to set your first meeting.
- 5. Performance Monitoring:** Your academic advisor, mentor, and other faculty and staff will be monitoring your performance throughout the spring 2017 semester. In order to help you do your best, your mentor may require specific actions that are tailored to your unique needs. These actions may include meeting with a counselor in the TCU Counseling Center, receiving tutoring at the Writing Center, visiting the Math Clinic, and/or meeting with an academic coach throughout the semester.
- 6. Exit Survey:** At the end of the spring 2017 semester, TCU will e-mail a survey to you to gather information about your experiences in the College 101 program. Please be sure to respond to the survey in a timely manner.
